I didn't realize until the end of September just how much I was hanging on to my idea of ministry! The ways that God brings things to our attention is pretty amazing - for me, the story of the Israelites griping in the desert after being freed from Egypt kept coming up, and I began to realize that I've been doing the same thing... oops! I've been so focused on what I miss about "normal" ministry that I wasn't fully paying attention to the ways that God is nudging me forward.

I've begun to see that when I experience God's peace in the midst of upheavals, **it doesn't just surpass the understanding of others**, it surpasses even my own understanding!
